BILL NO.	TITLE of BILL	ACTION
SENATE 1	Universal Free School Meals (Education) This Act shall require schools to serve meals that meet USDA nutritional standards. No student shall be charged, and no meal debt shall be created.	
SENATE 2	Artificial Intelligence Ban in K–12 Schools Act (Communications and Technology) This Act prohibits schools from using AI for teaching, grading, testing, or creating lessons. Students may not use AI to do homework, projects, or tests. Teachers and staff may not use AI to grade work or write materials for students.	
SENATE 3	Lowering the Drinking Age Act (Health and Human Services) This Act is to adjust the legal drinking age in the Commonwealth from 21 to 18, aligning state law with the legal age for other adult responsibilities and promoting responsible alcohol education under controlled environments.	
SENATE 4	Lowering the Voting Age Act (Aging and Youth) This Act lowers the legal voting age from 18 to 16 years of age.	
SENATE 5	Recreational Use of Marijuana (State Government) This legislation would allow for the recreational use of marijuana for individuals 21 years of age or older.	
SENATE 6	No Classroom Electronics Act (Education) This Act prohibits students in any classroom during school hours to use any electronic device.	
SENATE 7	Ban Tik Tok Act (Communications and Technology) An act banning TikTok from usage in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.	
SENATE 8	Mandated Extracurricular Activities (Health and Human Services) This Act requires each student who attends a public, nonpublic, or charter school to participate in no less than one extracurricular activity each school year.	
SENATE 9	Required Drivers Screenings Over 70 Act (Aging and Youth) This Act requires Pennsylvania drivers over the age of 70 to undergo an annual eye screening and cognitive testing of traffic signs.	
SENATE 10	Minimum Wage Increase Act (State Government) The Act increases the state minimum wage.
